CSU Admission Policies and Selection Criteria:

The minimum admission requirements to transfer to CSU Campuses as an upper-division student are:

- Successful completion of at least 60 CSU transferable units that includes courses in GE Areas A1, A2, A3, and B4, courses in major, general education, and electives.
- Successful completion of courses in GE Areas A1, A2, A3 and B4 (Golden 4) with grade of C- or higher.
- Successful completion of 30 semester units of General Education with a grade of C- or better.
- Minimum GPA of 2.0 for resident students and 2.4 for California non-resident students. Some CSU campuses and majors may require a higher GPA for transfer; see a Counselor for more information.

Note:

- · A course may be listed in more than one GE area; however, it can be used to satisfy only one GE area.
- AP Exam credit may be listed in more than one area; however, it can be used to satisfy only one GE area.
- For the most up-to-date transfer information including general education and lower division major requirements, go to www.assist.org.
- Certification will be completed only before transferring. Certification will NOT be processed after students have transferred and are enrolled at a CSU campus
- What are "Golden Four" GE courses? Courses in GE Subareas A1, (oral communication), A2 (written communication), A3 (critical thinking) and B4 (math concept) are sometimes referred to as the "Golden Four". They are required for transfer admission to the CSU, and each of the four courses must be passed with a minimum grade of "C-", per Title 5 Section 40803.
- There are instances when a Cañada course is approved for a CSU GE area but the same course at CSM or Skyline is NOT approved for CSU GE (or vice versa). Check with an Academic Counselor for complete information.
