## **CSU Admission Policies and Selection Criteria**

### The minimum CSU campus admission requirements for upper division are:

- Successful completion of 60 CSU transferable units that includes courses in area A1, A2, A3, and B4, courses in major, general education, and electives.
- Successful completion of courses in areas A1, A2, A3, and B4 (Golden 4) with grade of "C-" or higher.
- Minimum GPA of 2.0 for resident students and 2.4 for non-resident students. Some CSU campuses may require a higher GPA for transfer, see a counselor for more information.

#### Note:

- A course may be listed in more than one area; however, it can only be used to satisfy one area.
- AP exam may be listed in more than one area; however, it can only be used to satisfy one area.
