California State University General Education Breadth CSUGE-B 2024 - 2025

The California State University General Education - Breadth (CSUGE-B) pattern is one option that allows students to fulfill lower-division general education requirements for transfer to all California State University (CSU) campuses. The curriculum consists of a 39-unit pattern with five areas of concentration.

* Courses listed in multiple areas shall be certified in one area only.

AREA A - ENGLISH COMMUNICATION AND CRITICAL THINKING Minimum 9 semester units (12 quarter units).

- One course from each group.

- A2 WRITTEN COMMUNICATION: English 101 or 105
- A3 CRITICAL THINKING: Communication Studies 160 or English 205 or Philosophy 100, 103* or 205

AREA B - SCIENTIFIC INQUIRY AND QUANTITATIVE REASONING Minimum 9 semester units (12 quarter units)

- One course in B1
- One course in B2
- One of the courses selected to fulfill the requirement for B1 or B2 must include a laboratory component or a separate course must be taken from B3. If a separate laboratory course is taken from B3, it must match one of the two lecture courses taken from B1 or B2.

The California State University, before awarding a degree, requires students to complete courses or examinations that address:

Area US-1 The historical development of American institutions and ideals

Area US-2 The Constitution of the United States and the operation of representative democratic government under that

constitution

Area US-3 The process of California state and local government

This requirement may be fulfilled prior to transfer by completing a combination of the courses listed below that satisfies all three areas of the requirement. The requirement may also be completed at a CSU after transfer. Students who have completed equivalent courses outside of the State of California must complete a course from Area US-3. Courses used to fulfill this requirement may also be used in Area D of the CSUGE-B pattern.
