Based on the assignment(s) in this course searching for information sources, answer the questions below to describe how you searched for the information sources you used, explain why you chose sources used for the assignment, and describe how you evaluated the relevance and credibility of the gathered information sources.

## Question 1: State the topic or question you used for an assignment in this course

# Question 2: Describe the <u>search</u> process you used to find information sources (articles, websites, books, etc.) on your stated topic or question for an assignment in this course. *Include*:

- 1. Where you searched for information sources (search engines, library databases, etc.)
- 2. What search terms or combination of terms you used in your search
- 3. How you refined/filtered the search results to focus on sources on your topic/question
- 4. In at least 100 words, explain why your search process was successful or unsuccessful

### Question 3: Describe one information source from your search that you did use for the class assignment

- 1. Identify one source you *did use* (include all of the information you recall, such as author, title, year of publication, URL, etc.)
- 2. In at least 100 words, explain how this source is relevant to your topic/question
- 3. In at least 100 words, explain the evidence you found that this source is credible; what makes it trustworthy?

## Question 4: Describe one information source from your search that you did not use for the class assignment

- 1. Identify one source you *did not use* (include all of the information you recall, such as author, title, year of publication, URL, etc.)
- 2. In at least 100 words, explain how relevancy to your topic/question is related to your decision not to use this
- 3. In at least 100 words, explain how credibility is related to your decision not to use this source
