Located within the Diversity and Inclusion Student Center, the QUSSC provides a dedicated space for LGBTQ+ students to build community, access resources, and establish networks. The center aims to enhance student engagement, support, and a sense of belonging, addressing the evolving needs of the LGBTQ+ community on campus.



Cultural Graduations

Cultural Graduation Celebrations are held in addition to the official university commencement ceremonies. FUTURE GROWTH

Engaging Students Post-Pandemic: CSUEB has been identifying effective ways to engage students in a post-pandemic environment, considering the increase in hybrid and online classes and the reduced number of students and events on campus compared to pre-pandemic levels. Priorities also include developing strategies to sustain a vibrant campus atmosphere despite decreased enrollment and fewer students physically present on campus.

Supporting Student Success Initiatives: Advocating for and enhancing support for student success initiatives will continue to be aimed at increasing retention and graduation rates, ensuring students have the necessary resources and guidance to graduate on time.
