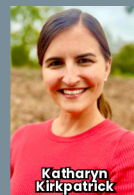

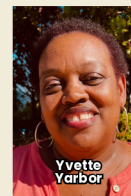

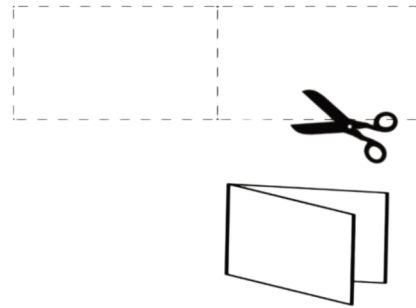

If you use a professional printer, we suggest you print 2-sided cards with white text on red card stock with rounded corners.
