

Western Undergraduate Exchange (WUE) Participation Agreement Form

Eligible students who return the WUE Participation Agreement Form prior to the fee payment deadline will be charged WUE fees. Forms received after the deadline will have WUE fees posted starting in the following academic term.

- WUE students are not eligible for California resident state university fees. Students cannot apply time accrued while participating in the WUE program to establish California residency.
- Students may receive the WUE tuition rate until completion of a bachelor's degree.
- Students must be enrolled fulltime (12 units or more) while in the WUE program and maintain academic standards required of non-resident students.

Western Undergraduate Exchange (WUE) Participation Agreement Form

What is WUE?

WUE is the Western Undergraduate Exchange, a program of the Western Interstate Commission for Higher Education (WICHE). Through WUE, students in Western states and commonwealth may enroll in participating four-year college programs at a reduced fee level. Cal State East Bay is a WUE member institution and offers fulltime students (with residency in WUE states and commonwealth) tuition at 150% of the regular resident state university fees.

Which states and commonwealth are included in the WUE network?

How much will students from WUE states and commonwealth save each year?

Is WUE available to graduate students?

No, only undergraduate students are eligible to participate in WUE. Cal State East Bay also offers the Western Regional Graduate Program (WRGP) tuition for select graduate programs, see the WRGP web page.

Can a WUE student select any of Cal State East Bay's majors?

Yes, as long as it is an undergraduate major and not a fully online program.

Do I need to apply to be part of the WUE program?

Yes. To participate, students with residency in a state participating in WUE must submit the WUE Participation Agreement Form (on back) to receive the WUE tuition rate.

How does WUE participation impact my ability to become a California resident?

WUE students are not eligible for California resident tuition. Students cannot apply time accrued while participating in the WUE program to establish California residency.

What if I don't want to be a WUE student?

You are not required to participate in the WUE program. If you prefer to pay California non-resident fees, simply do not send in the WUE Participation Agreement Form. If you have already signed up to be part of WUE and now wish to withdraw from the program, contact the WUE Coordinator at (510) 885-3500 or e-mail: admissions@csueastbay.edu and ask to be removed from the WUE program.
