# **ADMISSION CRITERIA**

After Applicants are sorted into priority groups (see previous page), the application review continues. Applicants earn points based on the criteria listed below.

### **REQUIRED CRITERIA**

- Prerequisite GPA based on submitted transcripts\*\*
  - Science prerequisites 7-year recency requirement.
  - **One** science prerequisite retake within 7 years is allowed without point deductions
  - More than one science prerequisite retake within 7 years deducts points off your application, for each additional retake
- TFAS Score
  - Minimum overall score 70%
  - Minimum English and Reading score 65%
  - ➤ 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> or 3<sup>rd</sup> attempt only, any version
- Personal Statement a few short answer questions

### **OPTIONAL CRITERIA**

- Health or Community-Related Experience (paid or unpaid) – within 3 years of application, 75 hrs. minimum
- Language Proficiency speaking and reading proficiency in English and one other language.
- \*\*The following conditions apply to the GPA:
- 1. A GPA of at least 3.00 in **both** of the following:
  - ALL prerequisite courses combined AND
  - ✓ Just the FOUR SCIENCE prerequisites
- 2. Must have a minimum grade of C or better in all prerequisites. A grade of C- is too low.
- 3. The Nursing Dept. accepts AP/IB exam credit. If the applicant is NOT submitting AP test scores, only one NON-science prerequisite course may be taken for credit or no credit.

#### **ADVISING**

The Cal State East Bay Nursing Program staff provides monthly Nursing Program Information Sessions via Zoom to discuss admission requirements and the application process. See the nursing website for dates/times.

Nursing office hours are Monday through Friday, 8:30 a.m. - 5:00 p.m. If any prerequisite courses are taken outside of California or at a private college, please see the TES website first and then contact the Department for equivalency advising.

# **ABOUT THE NURSING PROGRAM**

The Pre-Licensure program is a full-time, daytime undergraduate program for candidates new to Nursing. LVN's may apply to this program.

The Pre-Licensure HAYWARD Nursing Program begins in the fall, and the CONCORD Nursing Program starts in the spring.

# **ELIGIBILITY**

The number of students interested in entering the Pre-Licensure Nursing Program is greater than space available in clinical courses. This impacted program has additional eligibility and selection criteria beyond those required for university admission. **Minimum eligibility** consists of the following (please note that meeting minimum eligibility requirements does not guarantee admission).

- Submit transcripts with final grades for all required prerequisites by deadline and meet recency requirement. Grades of C and above are acceptable (a grade of C- is too low).
- GPA of at least 3.00 in the following: ALL prerequisite courses combined AND Just the FOUR SCIENCE prerequisites
- Minimum 70% overall TEAS score. Minimum 65% on English/Reading sections of TEAS. Online / Remote TEAS is accepted. Order from ATI and send the official TEAS score to Cal State East Bay by application deadline
- 4. Submit a Personal Statement with the application.
- Submit official transcripts to <u>NursingCAS</u> by deadline.
  - ➤ FALL DEADLINE = JANUARY 31
  - SPRING DEADLINE= AUGUST 31
- Meet all university admission requirements, including separate official transcripts by their published deadlines, or continue enrollment in good standing at Cal State East Bay. Must have a Cal State East Bay NetID to apply to Nursing.
- Priority Groups see definitions in the "SELECTION" section of the brochure.
- 8. **Additional Optional Point Categories** Due same deadline as application.

# TWO APPLICATIONS

- 1. Online **UNIVERSITY** application for Cal State East Bay Admission (unless already a student)
  - FALL APPLICATION Opens OCT 1 and closes on the CSU priority deadline which is typically NOV 30
  - SPRING APPLICATION Opens AUG 1 and closes on the CSU priority deadline which is typically AUG 31

IMPORTANT: If a transfer student, you must activate your Cal State East Bay NetID *before* you submit your nursing application (takes 24-48 hours).

# **PREREQUISITES**

Plan as far in advance as possible. Refer to <u>TES</u> to confirm approved courses, or contact Nursing Department for review. Courses are listed below with Cal State East Bay name and course number. Online labs are accepted from approved science courses.

- 1. Human Anatomy/Physiology I (BIOL 270) (4)
- 2. Human Anatomy/Physiology II (BIOL 271) (4)
- 3. Intro to Clinical Microbiology (BIOL 230) (4)
- 4. Chemistry for Health Sciences (CHEM 161) (4)

**OR** General Chem 1 (CHEM 111 + 111L) (5)

OR Survey of Organic Chem (CHEM 230 or 331) (5)

- 5. Accel. College Writing (ENGL 102), or GE Area A2 (3)
- 6. Public Speaking or Interpersonal Communication (COMM 100/4), or GE Area A1 (3)
- 7. Elements of Statistics and Probability (STAT 100) (3)
- 8. Workshop in Critical Thinking (PHIL 100), GE Area A3 (3)
- \*Anatomy and Physiology must be taken at the same school if combined sequenced courses (Anat/Phys I and Anat/Phys II), but may be taken at different schools if separate (Anatomy and Physiology are sperate.

All final prerequisite grades and official transcripts must be received by the deadline.

### SELECTION

- 1. Applicants are sorted into priority groups first.
- 2. Students given priority status are reviewed first.
- 3. Priority applicants who meet minimum requirements are then awarded points for admission criteria listed on the next page of the brochure (also see website).
- 4. Those with the highest point totals from the priority list are admitted.

Priority lists, point scales, and individual point totals are kept confidential within the department.

#### PRIORITY GROUPS

Cal State East Bay Nursing gives priority admission to the following three applicant groups, all considered equally:

- Cal State East Bay Students currently attending fulltime for at least last two semesters when applying
- Local Admission Area transfer students with a majority of units from public community colleges or universities in one of these six counties: Alameda, Contra Costa, San Francisco, San Mateo, Santa Clara, Solano
- Current Military or Veterans with honorable discharge

Due to the high volume of applications, applicants who do not receive priority status are unlikely to be admitted.
